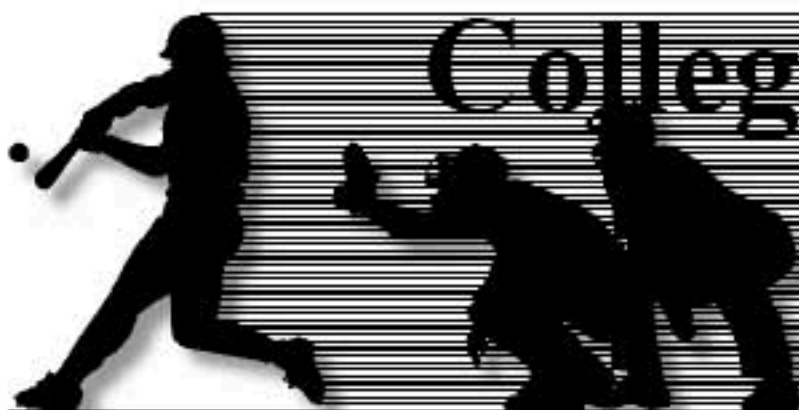

Record-Shattering Event

ABCA Convention Attracts Largest Attendance In History At 4,637

□ Event at the Nashville Opryland Hotel had 400 more attendees than previous mark of 4,195 set at the Chicago ABCA Convention in 2006.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — The 66th annual American Baseball Coaches Association convention in Nashville shattered all-time attendance records.

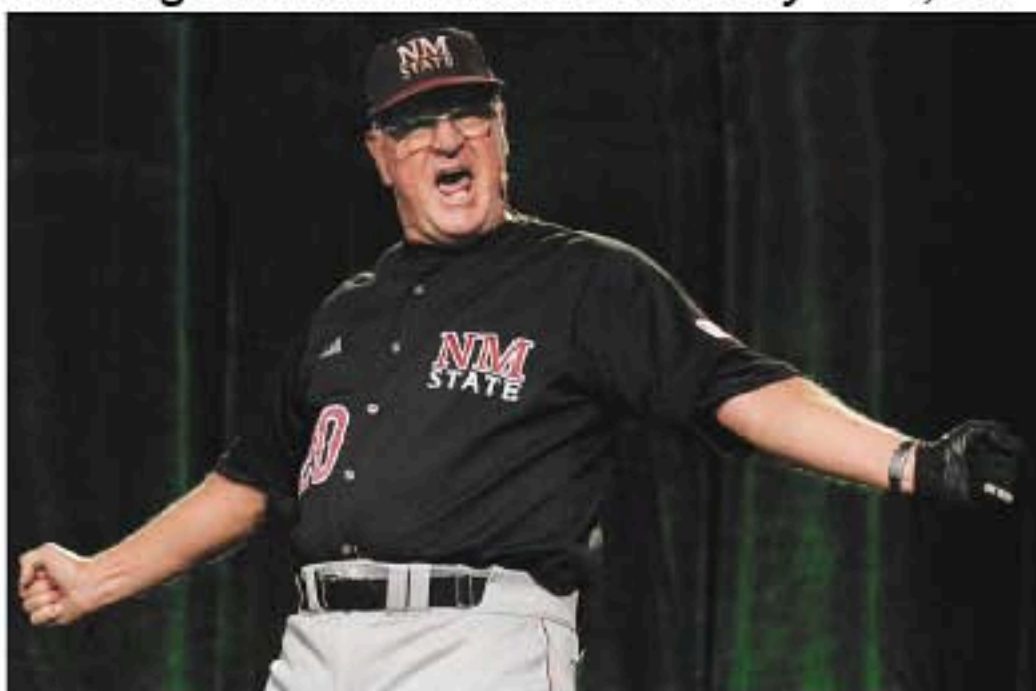
At least 4,637 attended, according to preliminary figures released shortly after the convention. A final total will be released in the near future.

This record setting total is more than 440 higher than the previous record of 4,195 set at the Chicago ABCA Convention in 2006.

The last time an ABCA Convention was held in Nashville, 3,758 attended in 2005 — almost 900 fewer than the 2011 convention.

The massive turnout was a testament to the hard work done by ABCA Executive Director Dave Keilitz and his talented staff of Betty Rulong, Nick Phillips, Juan Clark and Jeff Franklyn.

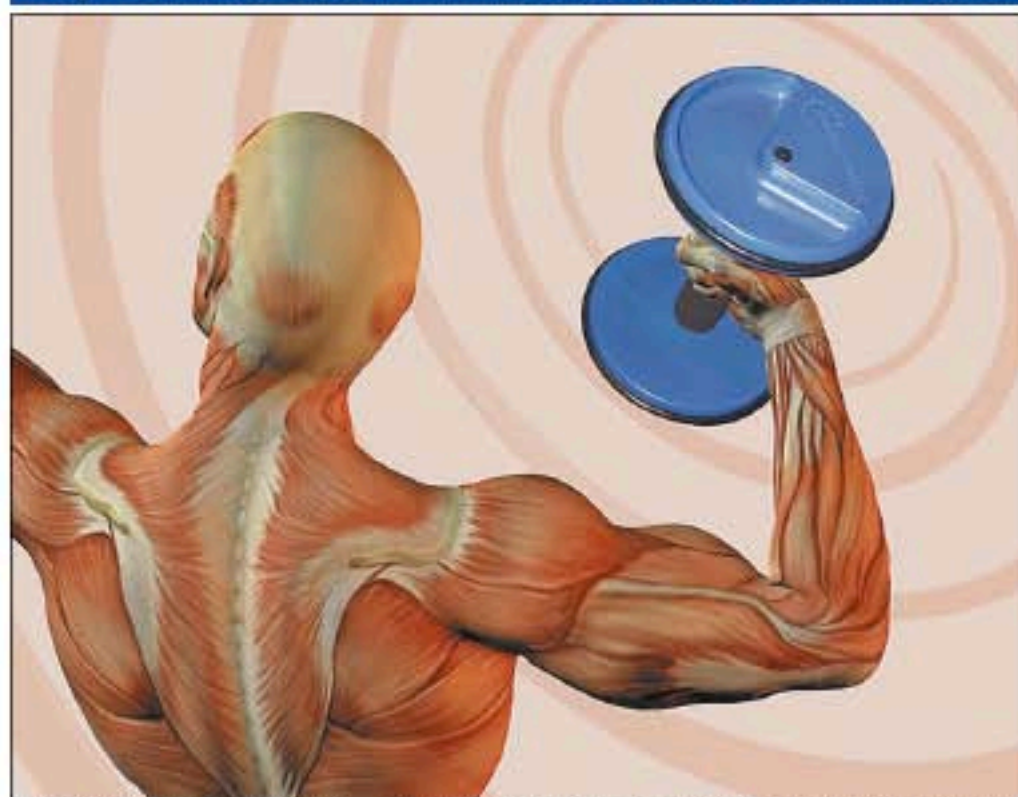

for team budgets. There were a number of emerging technology vendors from past shows who not only survived but continued to re-invest, re-develop and refine their products. There is an industry wide commitment to the term "user friendly."

Now in its 12th year, the Best in Show Awards from *Collegiate Baseball* newspaper has attempted to encompass a wide variety of concepts, applications and budgets.

Without further adieu, here are the 2011 winners as chosen by *Collegiate Baseball*.

Wonderweight

This unique product is used in rehabilitation, training and fitness. Tom House, pitching coach with the University of Southern California, loves this product and uses it for joint integrity with USC pitchers.

Innovation often appears simplistic.

Further investigation reveals years of development. Bio medical research labs, like the American Sports Medicine Institute, Washington University School of Medicine, and the Rod Dedeaux Research & Baseball Institute, continue to unlock the mysteries of human body movement.

Brilliant inventors create training devices that respond directly to the evolutionary knowledge base. However, the training industry must be on guard of opinion based products. Such is not the case of with the Wonderweight.

At first glance it appears to be an ordinary, well constructed, light dumbbell. But when you place it into your hand, one of the end weights rotates.

Try thinking of how the Wonderweight works in this manner. When seriously sipping a glass of wine, one swirls a small amount around in the glass to release the aroma. The swirl can go clockwise (pronation) or counter clockwise (supination).

Now imagine a dumbbell with a circular weight plate that rotates as you swirl it around. It works because the end weight plate is heavier on one side than the other. Thus after acquiring the rotational

swirl technique, the arm muscles engage to control and continue the rotation.

Subsequently, that motion creates a dramatic effect on much more of the body and muscular kinetic chains than one would initially believe. Wonderweight was thoroughly studied and tested for the seven months at the The Rod Dedeaux Research & Baseball Institute at the University of Southern California, under the direction of House.

In that study, Wonderweight was found to be a significant asset in pitcher pre-habilitation while improving velocity and accuracy.

If you haven't got the concept yet, visit YouTube and search for Wonderweight. You will see it in action. Remember it is one word.

The Wonderweight's web site explains it this way:

"The rhythmic, revolutions required to keep Wonderweight spinning is an active technique that engages and mobilizes restricted shoulder joints without stress, while also demanding the user's concentration. This is the essence of Wonderweight's effectiveness.

"If it's spinning, it's working. Unlike other devices which do not give adequate response, it is immediately apparent when this device is operating properly. It is spinning. It has no motor or other input except for that of the user, who by making rotary hand motions keeps the wheels of the device spinning. When they stop, it stops. It cannot be faked or appear to work if it's not being used properly. In order to keep Wonderweight spinning, one must engage both the mind and the body. This device has a surprising range of benefits. Most importantly it can safely engage injured muscles without strain."

The Target Pad

A unique catching tarp for pitchers has been developed called The Target Pad.

It features 10 removable round targets (two sets of 5) that range from 20 inches in diameter to four inches. One set features a white background with a red center. The

other set has a red background with white center.

These targets are attached to the unit using Velcro. Players and coaches can vary the size of the targets depending on the objective for training that day and the skill level.

The Target Pad is portable and durable. So it can be taken to any field and travel with the team.

Those pitching coaches who have toyed with the concept of effective velocity coined by Perry Husband can now have a target high and inside to a batter and low and outside. By mixing fastballs with off-speed pitches in these locations or flipping the locations to high and outside and low and inside, it will teach pitchers how to mix different pitch locations with different speeds to cause batters fits.

Only the imagination of a pitching coach can limit what possibilities this unique device can hold.

Ron Wolforth and Paige Bishop designed this innovative pitching target which has been integrated into the training of pitchers at the Texas Baseball Ranch owned by Wolforth.

The cost is \$199.95 and includes a training DVD by Wolforth.

Unique Bat Handle Design

Stop and take a good look at the bat knob pictured to the right.

They say a picture is worth a thousand words, and it sure applies here. Now that you know what it looks like, imagine this in your hand. Many of us have had a clumsy relationship with the knob.

The term ergonomic never applied to a bat.

During our baseball lives, many ripped apart batting gloves have taken place along with damage to the lower corner of hand.

The angled bat knob clearly

make sense to players. Catching on quickly in MLB, Pro-XR made its first Major League appearance last September in the hands of New York Mets infielder Mike Hessman.

A few weeks later, Prince Fielder of the Brewers picked it up.

to roll through that swing without crushing the palm.

- > Properly aligns hands with grain resulting in fewer broken bats.

- > Reduces the forces that contribute to hand injuries.

- > Optimal knob angle supports dynamic hand movement deliveries and effortless way improves the bat response.

- > Faster bat to zone speed.

- > Bottom hand firmly interlinks at the bottom of the shoulder of the knob as better touch and feel reduces accidental bat release during swing.

In the opening of this article, we talked about the "hey this sounds like a good idea" concept of product development.

Pro-XR is far away from that model. This quote is what we like about this company.

"With the patent submitted, I began testing the bat with local players at all levels of baseball in cages all over the Midwest. I was able to test the knob at Washington University School of Medicine with a leading doctor of biomechanics using cutting edge pressure sensing technology.

"The combined results from the batting cages and W.U.'s medical school confirmed my theory that a standard bat knob acts like a speed bump to a player's swing, and the angled knob of the Pro-XR provides a unique advantage," writes Gary Phelan, inventor and company President.

But how do you mass produce them?

"Making a Pro-XR is unlike any other bat making process currently being used. Since the Pro-XR knob is at an angle, a typical lathe can't make it alone, it requires cutting-edge four-point lathe technology and CAD-CAM design," said Phelan.

Pocket Radar

Pocket Radar is a breakthrough in Doppler speed radar technology.

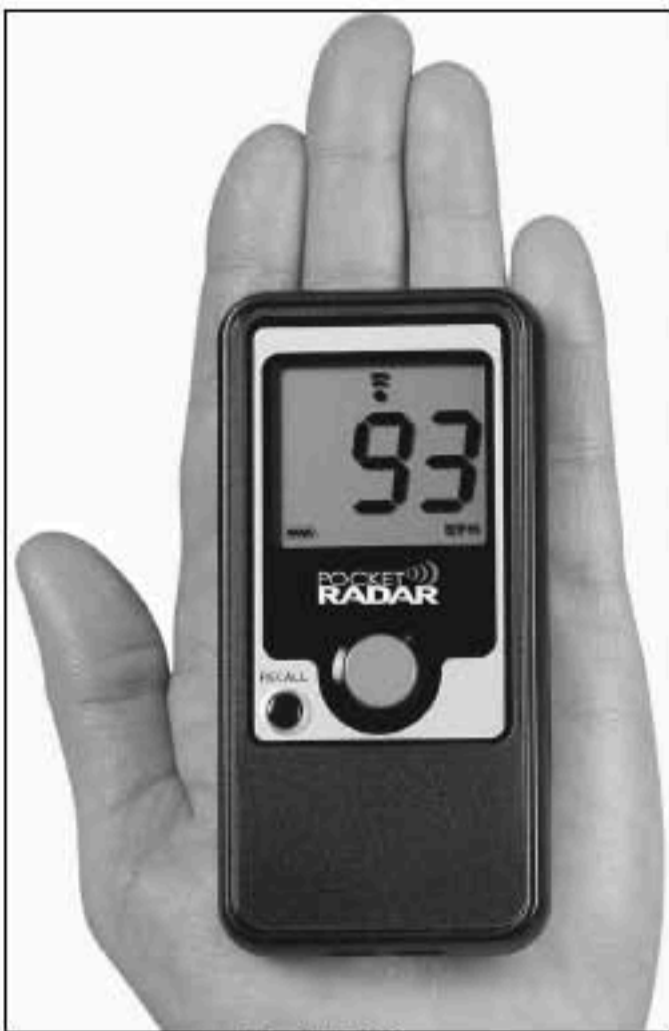
It is the world's smallest radar gun that can read the speed of baseballs up to 120 feet with an accuracy of plus or minus 1 mph.

While it has its limits in scouting because of the 120 foot limit for tracking the speed of baseballs, it is a remarkable tool for pitching coaches to track the velocity differences of pitches in bullpens that hurlers must have to be successful against hitters.

Andy Lopez, head coach at the University of Arizona, utilizes the pocket radar for his bullpens with great success. And a number of other coaches are finding this cell phone sized device worth its weight in gold.

This device can also be used for position player throwing speeds, runner speed and acceleration and the speed of the ball off the bat.

Pocket Radar is designed to never need recalibration. To test the ruggedness, units were dropped multiple times onto concrete from 10 feet above the ground. When it passed all of its specs from this height, a unit was dropped off a two story building onto concrete, and it was still just as accurate as when it

came from the factory.

Each unit is made of high impact polycarbonate plastic. It also has an instant-on technology and automatically shuts itself off after a period of inactivity.

While the limit to track a baseball's velocity is 120 feet, you can track the speed of a car up to 1/2 mile away. Pocket Radar has the capability of measuring speeds from 7 mph to 375 mph.

What is even more remarkable is that it runs on two AAA batteries and can provide over 10,000 speed readings from a single set of batteries. It comes with a hard shell case.

Hitters Power Drive

The Hitters Power Drive teaches hitters to better utilize their lower body muscles to gain power.

The same auditory click feedback used in the Pitcher Power Drive (given one of *Collegiate Baseball's* Best of Show awards in 2009) is incorporated in the Hitters Power Drive.

When the hitter utilizes his lower body correctly, the upper plate of the device drops and strikes the lower plate and makes a metallic click noise for positive feedback.

The upper foot plate has a built in adjustable foot replacement pad to create a slight inward angle on the back foot to simulate a live hitting stance.

The device can be adjusted for left hand, right hand and switch hitters to their own personal stance preference.

Also, the training aid will let the batter know if their back foot is on the back edge and weight and balance is not positioned correctly by dropping plate slightly backwards and hitting a stop which makes an auditory click for negative feedback.

The Hitters Power Drive can be used for dry drills, batting tee and live hitting. It is portable with a built in carrying handle to be used indoors or at the field.

It is made of 1/4 inch steel in the USA and costs \$195.

Electric Lifting Cages

This is a product that has undeniable logic and flies directly in the face of conventional baseball L-screens.

While standing behind this screen, you do have to adjust visually to what is in front of you.

But after an initial adjustment, you realize the triangular shape of this A-Screen is much easier to throw behind and just about full proof.

I'm sure we have all heard about horror stories of coaches being hit by batted balls due to not pitching behind the L-screen correctly.

In fact, a coach died one year ago after getting hit in the neck by not being fully behind an L-screen.

This new A-Screen offers a

solution especially for the amateur or Little League coach who doesn't spend several hours a week behind a screen throwing batting practice.

Another benefit to the A-Screen is its portability and ease of assembly.

The A-Frame breaks down small enough to fit in the trunk of a car. The provided storage bag is easy to carry.

Although the steel poles are very strong, they only add up to 32 pounds. We all have seen numerous outdoor batting cages equipped with make shift L-Screens that are falling apart, patched together, and have been left outside over several months and in some cases years as they dry rot. (A lawsuit waiting to happen!)

The ability to spend two to five minutes setting and taking apart the A-Screen and knowing the net is sturdy and safe to throw behind is a very attractive feature.

The price is reasonable at \$244 (\$219 + \$25 standard ground shipping), so a team can replace a couple of their worn down ticking time bomb L-Screens without breaking the bank. <http://morrowssports.com>

FastArm

The FastArm is a device that is designed to do a number of progressive things for pitchers.

The unique angled bar and weight of it creates an arm action that is desired by most high level instructors and orthopaedic surgeons.

As you take the FastArm back, it allows you to use your natural arm path to get to the device to a position that keeps the arm in a preferred biomechanical position.

As you move your arm forward

in the throwing motion, it allows external rotation and promotes external rotation on the follow through which is vital in maintaining arm health and velocity.

Although you do not throw the FastArm, it is a great tool to enhance and maintain ranges of motion associated with the throwing motion.

Used at slower speeds, its weight is great for a quick warm up of the arm.

In an era where throwing arm injuries are rapidly increasing, this product can be used to prevent injury as well as a great tool for the player returning to throwing post-injury.

One of the most significant issues with players recovering from an injury is getting the arm into a natural biomechanical throwing position. Typically there is some hesitance from the player as they guard their arm from experiencing the pain they once felt.

V-Flex Hitting System

The science behind V-Flex is very complicated, but the usability of the system during batting practice is undeniable.

The inventor, Tim Nicely, sought to design a product line that would impact the "brain" and not the mind over a 22-year period.

V-Flex goes beyond the conscious mind and the eyes to train the brain itself.

Since baseball's inception back in the 1800's, no coach has ever taught the brain the parameters of the strike zone.

But through a three-phase training system, Nicely has come up with brain based learning.

V-Flex is the sum of specific knowledge derived from neurology, psychology, cellular tensesegrety, ophthalmology, physics and mathematics.

It addresses the core issues in hitting as in applied science by taking knowledge from the scientific community and applying it to the physical environment.

In essence, V-Flex helps every batter stop swinging at bad pitches by manipulating certain brain functions.

One of the first benefactors of the V-Flex system was Clark Wormsley of Webb School in Knoxville, Tenn. He was inducted into the Tennessee Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame

in 2008 after winning over 400 games.

Halfway through the 2010 season, his team began using the V-Flex system. Clark mentioned prior to beginning the system that his players were good, but that they needed more discipline at the plate if they were going to win a state title. He had coached in several state tournaments but had never won one.

In one game, the Spartans had 21 hits and zero strikeouts. In another, they had 14 hits and zero strikeouts.

When Webb got into tournament play, their level of discipline at the plate was undeniable. In five charted games, his players saw 582 pitches and only swung at 7 bad pitches. When the dust settled, Webb had won the state title.

Another big advocate of the V-Flex system is Steve Peterson, head coach at Middle Tennessee State University.

"We still must teach swing mechanics verbally, but V-Flex trains the hitters' brain to swing at strikes without having to say a word," said Peterson in the *Visual Reflex Hitting System* book published by Nicely.

"Hitters must work hard and train properly because this is no gimmick. It is a patented hitting system that fits into our daily practice schedule without a problem. Reading this book has allowed me to reevaluate some of my approaches, and I am glad I did. I am putting the V-Flex Hitting System to work because I want my hitters to get better, and if we swing at strikes, we will."

The 16-ounce size develops power, and the 21-ounce "on deck" size can be used in place of typical donuts that are placed on the barrel of the bat.

All current weighted products on the market are placed on the barrel of the bat causing a "casting" elongated swing, slowing down your swing causing less power and do not let you practice with live pitching.

The Hitting Jack-It was developed to place the weight in the middle of the bat and allows the hitter to use it hitting of the tee, during soft toss/front toss, or live pitching.

With today's youth hitters using lighter and lighter bats that can cause a false sense of bat speed and a more difficult transition to the larger barrel bats, the Hitting Jack-It can affordably decrease that transition time.

If you understand the value of information as a developmental tool, you will want this product.

Strategic software burst into

our lives from Stanford about 10 years ago.

Since then, information technology software has experienced a continual evolution. Unfortunately it is well known that baseball embraces technology the least of all the major sports. Those that have taken the time to acquire this training system concept have excelled beyond the limit of their talents.

The current system evolution is amazing. There is no hardware or downloadable software to install.

The EDGE system is completely web based; iPod, iPad platforms and coming in the spring Droid compatible. Specific and detailed reports on pitchers and hitters tendencies and spray charts for defensive alignment are instantly accessible.

Some reject charting software without realizing that a great benefit of information technology is in the training and development of your own players beyond scouting opponents.

Baseball teams can slip into a management style of just playing games, particularly in travel teams. Dehuded into the notion that more play means more skill development, coaches miss the information age's ability to pinpoint weakness and acknowledge strength.

Swing Development System

ISO baseball is a science-based set of instructional videos, devices, and drills that are designed to help baseball and softball hitters reach their maximum level of performance.
